

Limón New York Workshop for Teachers 2012

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What are the Workshop dates?

Monday August 13 – Friday August 24. Schedule will run Monday to Friday both weeks.

Registration is at 9:30am on Monday August 13th. First session starts at 10am with a two-hour technique class. This will be followed by an orientation to the program, when you will be given a detailed schedule. After a lunch break, there will be two afternoon sessions, ending at 4:30pm.

Where is the Workshop located?

The workshop is located in Manhattan and hosted by Dance Education, NYU Steinhardt, New York - Department of Music and Performing Arts Professions - 35 W. 4th Street, Suite 777, New York

Do I need teaching experience or previous experience in Limon Technique?

The workshop is open to teachers and graduates of teaching programs. It is also open to dancers trained in the Humphrey/Limon tradition who are interested in learning to teach the technique. It is designed to guide each participant to find an individual approach to Limón-based teaching.

What is a typical day?

The anticipated day to day schedule is from 10am- 4:30pm

10:00 – 12:00 Technique class

12:00 – 12:45 Principles sessions

12:45 – 1:30 Lunch and Journal break

1:30 – 3:00 afternoon workshop

3:00 – 4:30 afternoon workshop

Participants will be asked to select several evening classes at Peridance to observe (6:00 – 7:30pm) class schedule is available at <http://www.peridance.com> (details given at registration). Be prepared to keep a notebook and specific suggestions will also be given about how to observe.

Can you give more information about the workshop content?

This workshop will examine the use of Humphrey/Limón principles in contemporary dance training. The program will include daily technique classes, an exploration of the underlying principles, phrases from repertory (contemporary and classic) and the use of rhythm and music in Limon classes. Participants have opportunities to present class materials and contemporary dance phrases.

Can I attend part-time?

No. It may be possible to attend the first week only, depending on availability. You will be placed on a waiting list and a decision will be made after August 1st.

Can I observe workshop sessions?

Unless you have an injury or mobility issues, you are expected to participate in all movement and pedagogical sessions. Unless you are fully registered for the workshop, class/workshop session observations are not permitted.

What should I prepare? Will I be required to teach?

This workshop is open to experienced dance teachers and Limón-trained dancers. Participants will have opportunities to teach class work and phrase material. You should bring note book, but you will not be asked to do any writing that you would turn in to us; if you currently teach with recorded music you might bring some favorite examples to share.

How do I get to NYU Steinhardt?

Can I apply for a financial assistance?

10% Discount available for full-time registrations only received before May 1st, 2012. No financial assistance available.

What are the fees?

Full program tuition \$790

Technique class only - \$90 per week. No single classes.

A \$100 registration fee is due at time of application. This amount is deductible from the total tuition fee.

10% Discount available for full-time registrations only received before **May 1st, 2012**.

Final payment due no later **than August 1st 2012**.

What happens if I need to withdraw?

Any refunds will only be considered by written cancellation. Tuition fees received to date will be refunded if cancellation is received before July 16, 2012. Cancellations received by August 3, 2012 will receive a 50% refund.

Requests made August 3 will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. A non-refundable \$100 deposit is applicable in all cases.
